IF YOU ARE ON ANY BLOOD THINNER NOT ON THIS LIST PLEASE CALL OUR OFFICE TO CLARIFY WHEN TO STOP THE MEDICATION PRIOR TO SURGERY.

Be mindful that many over the counter medications include Aspirin and Ibuprofen

MEDICATIONS THAT ANESTHESIA REQUIRES YOU TO STOP PRIOR TO SURGERY (Your surgery will be CANCELLED if you do no follow their rules)

(If you have questions regarding your medication contact the doctor that prescribes them)

<u>THE NIGHT BEFORE SURGERY</u>: Per Anesthesia Do Not eat or drink anything after midnight the night before your surgery. However, you may be instructed to take a sip of water so that you may take certain medications. The Phone Assessment Nurse with review this with you.

<u>THE DAY OF SURGERY</u>: In the lobby of the building the personal at the security desk will direct to you the surgery center registration/check in area.

- 2) Bring your health insurance card
- 3) Do NOT bring valuables or jewelry
